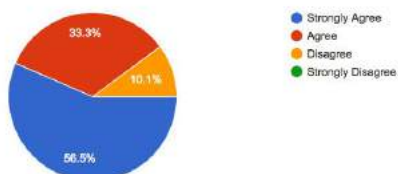

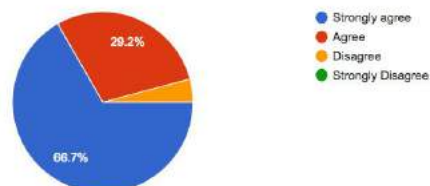
We would like to introduce a hospitality component (catering, coffee making, food service and career pathways) to our foods programme. I would like to see this at RIS.

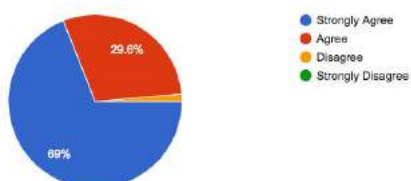
We would like to introduce a robotics and coding component to our 3D printing. I would like to see this opportunity given to the students at RIS.

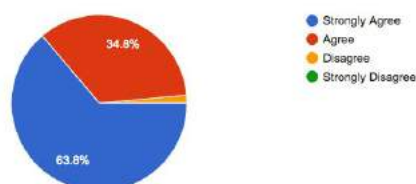
We would like to retain Hard Materials at RIS.

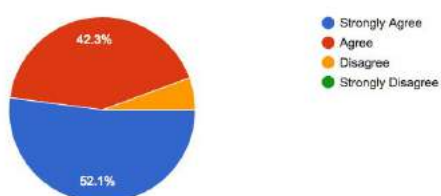
We would like to retain Multi-Materials at RIS (electronics, eco speaker design).

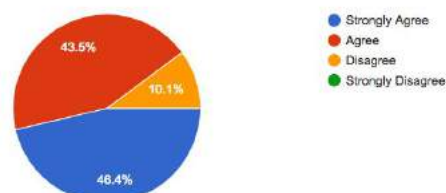
We would like to retain our Kapa Haka group at RIS.

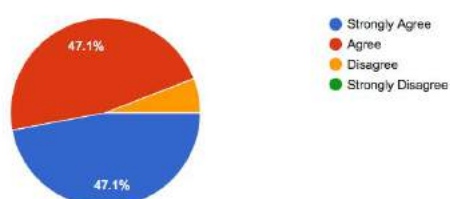
We would like to retain our Pasifika dance groups at RIS.

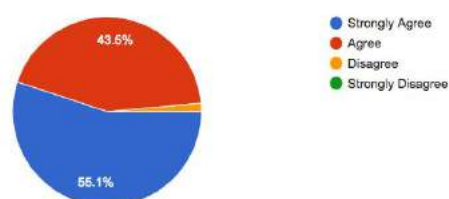

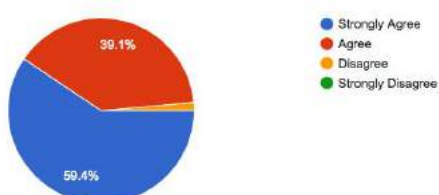

Cooper Turner represented NZ at the Karate World Cup in Australia. He competed against 12-13yr old males from U.K, America, Australia and NZ in the brown and black belt division. There were 24 boys in total and Cooper came away with a very happy 4th place in the WORLD. Cooper trained for two years and looked amazing.

Cooper and his GKR Karate family also set an official Guinness World Record for the most boards broken simultaneously. The previous record was 204, and after the counting by official Guinness World Record adjudicators was completed, it was confirmed the total was 433! Cooper will be in the 2018 Guinness Book of records so keep an eye out for him.



BMX World Championships

Tipene Kennedy participated at the recent BMX World Championships held in Rock Hill, South Carolina, USA in July.

We had 1 hour practice sessions Sunday morning, and Monday afternoon. Racing started on Tuesday with Tipene riding a Cruiser (24" bike) for 10-12 boys. Tipene won both of his qualifying races to advance to the 1/8ths. In that race he also came first, qualifying him to the quarter finals. Unfortunately Tipene went over the start gate too early (nerves we think) and came 8th, meaning he was not able to advance to the semi's, but is still in the top 24 in the world out of 89 riders. Wednesday was a rest day, with 20" 11 boys riding on the Thursday. With the bad start on Tuesday, this played a lot on Tipene's mind but managed a 3rd, 2nd & 3rd in his qualifying races to advance to the 1/8ths. He then had a good start but got squished in the 1st corner & was not able to recover coming in 5th place. Still he is in the top 48 riders out of 109 in the world for 12 boys!!

We were then able to enjoy Rockhill & Charlotte with some sightseeing & shopping, watching the Elite riders on Saturday afternoon/evening before flying home on Tuesday 1 August, and getting back to NZ on the 3rd of August. Next year BMX Worlds 2018 are held in Baku, Azerbaijan. At the moment Tipene is enjoying playing league with his mates, so we shall see what happens next year!!
