

ROSEHILL INTERMEDIATE

Proposed Enrolment Scheme Description

Effective from 2021

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

The boundary begins to the North taking in Waiata Shores from the intersection of Te Napi Drive and Great South Road. Travel south along Great South Road until Taka Street (includes even addresses 16 and below and odd addresses 13 and below only) until it meets the railway.

Travel south down the railway passing Opaheke Road towards 258 Sutton Road (excluded) and travel country west towards Great South Road to include Coulthard Terrace and Alderton Place (included).

Travel south along Great South Road (even addresses 600 and below and odd addresses 595 and below included) and travel North West across country following the coastline of Drury Creek, Bottle Top Bay (encompassing the Hingaia Peninsula) towards the Pahurehure Inlet to the North which continues until back to the starting point.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First Priority:** This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.

- **Second Priority:** will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- **Third Priority:** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth Priority:** will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth Priority:** will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- **Sixth Priority:** will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth or fifth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary. Under Section 11G (1) on the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
