News from the Board

The Board of Trustees would like to express their thanks to all those who support Rosehill Intermediate School.

We can not run events like the Year 8 Careers Day and Wider Living Week without people stepping up to speak to our students about their careers and parent assistance on trips.

So why is it so important for your child to be able to work collaboratively?

Firstly, it helps them develop their social skills: Collaborative learning makes students with different backgrounds, race, or upbringing work together. Our students are given problems to solve, and to do this they need to communicate openly and be accepting of each other.

Secondly, they can learn from their peers: Many students have different skills, passions, and knowledge. In a small collaborative group, they can have lots of different answers to the questions given to them and can learn new things from one another.

Thirdly, it helps them build trust: In order to achieve a set goal or task, students need to work together. For effective collaboration to work and for students to reach a common goal, they need to learn to trust each other.

Fourth, it engages them in their learning: In a small group setting, each student has the opportunity to express her or his ideas. Being able to do so, and being heard can give the students a feeling of importance and of value. The learning experience becomes more fun, and students are eager to learn more.

Fifth, it helps them gain confidence: As students work as a team, they also receive more support from each other which allows them to gain confidence in their thinking. Collaborative learning can help shy students express themselves more.
