## News from the Board Strike

Dear Parents

The Board of Trustees of Rosehill Intermediate can't provide teaching for students during the upcoming strike on Monday 12th November

The NZEI had advised the Rosehill Intermediate Board of Trustees that Mrs Maria Owers and the teachers at our school will be taking strike action on Monday 12th November for the full day.

The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff, and unfortunately decided that we can't provide the normal teaching services during the strike. It is important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children on the day of the strike.

If this is difficult we can still supervise a **small** number of students if required. I know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike, but please be assured that student safety is our main concern.

### IT'S TIME YOUR CHILDREN HAD THE EDUCATION THEY DESERVE

Schools are facing a teacher shortage crisis, with a 40% drop in people training to be teachers; and a growing number of school-aged children. In term three, 50% of schools reported that they did not have enough teachers. Schools are struggling to attract teaching staff, and that problem looks set to worsen.

There is also a desperate need for more support for children with additional learning needs.

Yet, the Government has a bumper surplus of \$5.5 billion, more than enough to fix the issues in primary education (\$0.9b).

Another hint for helping your child develop their COLLABORATIVE attribute  
**THINK ABOUT THE QUESTION**

Studies have shown that tasks that are 'puzzling' and 'needs some real thinking' are the most effective for learning the art of collaborative work. This is because they provide the need for children to share their thoughts and ideas, to talk about to solve problems and make decisions.

However, we have to make sure that the task is not too overwhelming. It is important, particularly early on, to structure tasks, splitting them into 'bits'. This means at home instead of giving them a huge time consuming task with little instruction - 'chunk ' it down. Give them a little bit each to do in a given time and then as a family/group meet and look at what has been accomplished. This is a great opportunity to work as 'one' and your child/ren will see that what they have done has been recognised and accepted by others.

It might be an idea to begin by having a family/group brainstorming session in order to share ideas of maybe 'how' before the task is started, giving a starting point, and to allow the whole family to really understanding what is needing to be done.

Year 7's have been using the design process, which is a key feature across all of the technology disciplines, to produce cafe style foods while developing a high level of culinary skills. Emphasis has been on safety, hygiene and working within a budget.

Year 8's have been making modifications to existing recipes to produce Fusion Kai alongside learning skills for managing time and resources. The major focus has been on taste testing, reflection and evaluation of products. They have also been studying about authentic storage problems and how Technology has assisted in finding solutions.

Rosehill Intermediate students who catch buses will have to make their own transport arrangements.

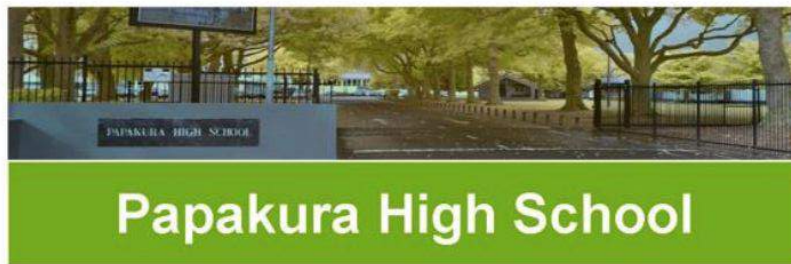
